schedule Stand behind your child and physically guide him/her to the schedule Limit verbal instructions Use the visual schedule to communicate the sequence of activities Your child should manipulate the schedule Guide your child's hand to the schedule, so that your child, not the adult, checks items off the checklist or moves pictures
