Trees should be planted on 20 feet squares unless some system of pruning or training is used to increase density Many commercial orchards today are moving to high density planting on wire to reduce harvest ladder work and improve percentage of high value fruit PEARS - Do not use dwarf root stock Select at least two varieties, three would be

1 Select fruits with a strong flavour and high acidity The aroma of the fruit should be strong and pleasant and the fruit should have that distinctive passion fruit flavour and acidity Avoid off-flavoured fruit, eg woody taste The pulp should also be orange-coloured, rather than yellow 2 Select fruits

**Tree Fruit Varieties for Idaho**

North Star - The fruits are large with a thin, light-red skin, red flesh, red juice, and a free pit The trees are naturally dwarfed, growing 6-12 feet tall Very cold hardy and self fruitful Developed by the Minnesota Agricultural Experiment Station from a seedling found in Yugoslavia

Smaller sized (dwarf) apple trees require the least amount of space Dwarf apple trees require about 75-100 square feet each and grow 8-10 feet tall Semi-dwarfs require 125-200 square feet each and grow to 10-20 feet Standard trees take 300-400 square feet or more and may be over 30 feet tall The ideal site for apple trees is on

Besides producing fruit trees of varied genetics and physical characteristics, some of the main benefits of growing seedlings include 1) obtaining desired rootstock material onto which the desired variety or cultivar will be budded or grafted (vegetative propagation) and 2) producing a tree with a taproot for post-planting tree stability
