### **Relationships between the Physical Education Course ...**

Sportsmanship behaviors in physical education lessons are thought to be closely related to some personal traits of students First of all, it is required to investigate with which personal traits of students sportsmanship behaviors are associated, and programs should be prepared accordingly Tendency to violence is among important personal traits
