Definition: "TARES" - "tares" are a weed-like plant that LOOKS exactly like wheat, but does not have the wheat kernel, so therefore it is of no value Jesus used "tares" as an example of people who would APPEAR on the OUTSIDE to be saved, and members of His kingdom, but would actually be empty and false We have Jesus' own

tares Zizanion is a species of darnel called 'bearded darnel' (see Vines Expository Dictionary & Strong's Concordance) This is a poisonous kind of rye grass that looks just like wheat until the ear appears This is the key to the parable - darnel looks like wheat for a time until the harvest, when the fruit should appear in the ear; but
