GUIDELINES FOR RECOGNITION, ASSESSMENT AND ...

- Pain assessment should accompany every patient assessment
- Treat predictable pain - pain associated with surgery is 100% predictable
- Pain assessment is key to determining the degree and duration of pain treatment but should not replace the adage of treating predictable pain

There are a variety of pain scales used for pain assessment, for patients from neonates through advanced ages The three most common scales recommended for use with pain assessment are: • The numeric scale • The Wong-Baker scale (also known as the FACES scale) • The FLACC scale (Health Care Association of New Jersey, 2011)

A complete Pain Assessment shall be done if the Pain Rating Scale score is above 0 in the circumstances listed in II-B, no 1-5 indicated on The Wong Baker Faces or FLACC scales, a 1 or 2 as indicated by the PAINAD included with the Pain Management Tools B A Pain Assessment shall be conducted whenever a new onset of pain occurs
