Evolution and Human Sexuality

avored by selection if it enhanced mating success Darwin catalogued many examples, and emphasized roles of male-male competition and female choice as the processes of sexual selection giving rise to many differences between the sexes (or sexual dimorphisms), such as the large antlers of many male deer

Possible Interventions for the Function of Escape

- engaging in disruptive behavior Out-of-seat behavior is defined as any incident in which a student leaves his or her seat without first getting permission from the teacher Related behaviors, such as "scootching" one's seat toward another desk are usually scored as out-of-seat Instructors often build in certain exceptions to this rule
