The Mode of Theoretical Knowledge and Practical Knowledge ...

Unlike the highly abstracted theory, practical knowledge is tightly connected with unique context and highly task-based, so it is the reflection of authentic working situation (Lave,1996) Generally, practical knowledge is less likely to be coded, but it can be illustrated as a process: decision, planning, implementing etc(Kieran Setiya, 2009)

LEARNING THEORIES Ausubel's Learning Theory

Ausebel's theory also focuses on meaningful learning According to his theory, to learn meaningfully, individuals must relate new knowledge to relevant concepts they already know New knowledge must interact with the learner's knowledge structure Meaningful learning can be contrasted with rote learning

is a theory of knowledge and learning in which the individual generates his or her own knowledge, constructs knowledge in the process of tackling problems; the current meanings of learners connected with new ideas and for this reason as stated by von Glassersfeld knowledge as a process is a product of knowing
