social and emotional understanding, relationships and social interactions with familiar adults, relationships and social interactions with peers, and symbolic and sociodramatic play SED 1: Identity of Self in Relation to Others This measure highlights how the child shows increasing awareness of self as distinct from and also related to others

Social and emotional needs and wellbeing Social and emotional wellbeing is closely related to the concept of mental healthand requires that social, emotional and psychological needs are able to be met and that distress resulting from unmet needs in other domains is minimised (eg physical, informational, practical and spiritual needs)
